### **Quick reference guide**





### Dear Audi Driver,

The aim of this quick reference guide is to introduce you to the main features and controls of your vehicle.

#### This quick reference guide cannot replace the information contained in the Owner's Manual; it is therefore important that you also read the notes and warnings in the Owner's Manual.

### Locking and unlocking the vehicle

The central locking system locks and unlocks all the doors, the boot lid and the tank flap. It can be operated with the remote control or by turning the key in the lock.

### Operating the radioactivated remote control

Press the appropriate button for about 1 second.

### Unlocking button

Open one of the doors or the boot lid within about 60 seconds, otherwise the vehicle will lock itself again automatically.


**2** Unlocking button for boot lid Press the button for at least 1 second.

**3 Locking button** The turn signals flash once to confirm that the doors and tailgate/boot lid are properly closed.

**4** Folding out the master key Press the release button.

Folding away the master key Press the button and fold the key away.

*Warning:* The doors and windows cannot be opened from



inside the vehicle if it has been locked from the outside.

### Anti-theft alarm

The alarm system is automatically **set** when the car is locked. The alarm system is **switched off** automatically when you unlock the vehicle with the remote control.

Note: If you unlock the vehicle by inserting the key in the driver's door, the ignition must be switched on within 15 seconds, otherwise the alarm will be triggered. If you unlock the boot lid by turning the key in the slot, the alarm will be triggered **immediately**.

### Adjusting front seats

#### 1 Head restraint

To adjust the angle of the head restraint, push it forwards or backwards as desired.

2 Easy Access A Pull the lever up and tip the backrest forwards.

### 3 Easy Access B

Push the switch forwards or backwards to move the seat in the desired direction.

4 Adjusting seat height and moving seat backwards or forwards

Press the switch in the appropriate direction:

- Raises/lowers the seat at the front
- Raises/lowers the seat at the rear
- Raises/lowers the whole seat
- 5 Backrest and head restraint height adjustment Press the switch in the appropriate direction:



- Backrest further upright or reclined
- Head restraint higher or lower

6 Adjusting lumbar support Press the appropriate part of the adjuster control to move the lumbar support to the desired position.

### Safety

Seat belts must be worn on every journey, even on short trips in town. This applies to the front and rear seats. To ensure that the seat belts, belt tensioners and airbags are fully effective, note the following points:

#### Adjust seat and sit in correct position

The front seats should not be positioned too close to the steering wheel or dashboard. Maintain a distance of at least 25 cm from the steering wheel. It is important to sit in a normal, upright position and set the backrest so it is fully against your back. The top of the head restraint should be at eve level (or higher). Put your feet in a comfortable position in the footwell.



### Safety of children in the vehicle



Children under 12 should travel on the rear seat. They must be protected by a child restraint system which complies with the European standard ECE R 44 and is suitable for the child's weight and height. The safest place for the child restraint system is behind the front passenger's seat. Make sure that the system is properly secured. The retractor mechanism of the seat belts can be locked to secure a child safetv seat.

Please observe the notes in the Audi Owner's Manual and refer to the manufacturer's instructions for the child seat.







### 8 Windscreen wiper and washer lever



### Windscreen:

- 0 Off
- 1 Brief wipe

2 Intermittent wipe Move control A to alter the wiper intervals.

### Function selector switch for on-board computer

Press the top or bottom of rocker switch **B** to show the various displays in turn. Press and hold button **C** to reset display to zero.

### Function selector for display modes

Press button **C** repeatedly to select the following displays: on-board computer (single journey memory) and total journey memory), navigation system and telematics, or to switch the display off.

## Switch for acoustic parking aid

The parking aid is automatically activated when reverse gear is engaged. Press the switch to activate the parking aid manually if you are driving forwards into a tight space.

Selector lever positions on vehicles with automatic gearbox

- P Parking lock


To move the selector lever out of position P or N, or into position P or R, press the interlock button on the selector lever handle and the brake pedal simultaneously.

*Note:* Use the foot brake to hold the vehicle when stationary with the engine running (in all selector lever positions other than **P**).

*Warning:* Do not move the selector lever to positions **P** or **R** when the vehicle is moving.

### Manual gear selection (Tiptronic)

The Tiptronic program enables you to change gear manually. To do this, move the selector lever out of position **D** into the Tiptronic gate on the right. Press the selector lever forwards briefly to shift up a gear, or push the lever back to shift down a gear.

### Switch for opening and closing the soft top

### Opening the soft top

To open the soft top, pull up the switch (2) for the soft top until the operation is completely finished.

### Closing the soft top

To close the soft top, press down the switch  $\Rightarrow$  for the soft top until the operation is completely finished.

Note: If the switch is released while the soft top is opening or closing, the operation will be stopped. The warning lamp in the instrument cluster will go out when the soft top is completely opened or closed. Opening and closing of the soft top is only possible when the ignition is switched on.



### Switching on:

Press the lever in direction **2**. Then briefly press button **A** to store the current speed in the memory and constantly maintain this speed.

### Adjusting stored speed:

Push the lever up (+) or down (-) to increase or decrease the speed you are travelling. The speed will then be stored when you release the lever.

### Switching off temporarily:

Press the brake or clutch pedal, or press the lever in direction 1 (without engaging the click stop). To resume the programmed cruising speed, pull the lever in direction 2.

### Switching off completely: Press the lever in direction 1

(so that the click stop is engaged).

## **34** Electric windows

Press or lift the switch as far as the **first stop** and hold it until the window has moved to the desired position.

### "One-touch" function

Press or lift the switch as far as the **second stop**; the window will automatically open or close all the way.
